- Participants must have typical hearing
- Participants must not be taking any medication

[The Blackberry Project](#) research lab at UT Dallas is conducting a study on how teenagers use Instagram. They are currently recruiting teenagers from the community who are between 13

Participation requirements:

- Teens and a parent must attend a 75 minute session at UT Dallas
- Teens must be between 13-15 years old and speak English
- Teens will complete surveys on their social media use, personality, body image, and well-being
- Teens will browse a few posts from their Instagram account using an eye-tracker
- Teens must have an active Instagram account, have no history of epilepsy or proneness to seizures, have no medical device susceptible to infrared light, not wear heavy glasses or contact lenses, or be diagnosed with any of the following conditions: cataracts, amblyopia, strabismus, mydriadsis, or nystagmus
